Tag der Donauschwaben

The earliest of many Philadelphia area German-American annual fall fests. Tag Donauschwaben, took place on Sunday August 25. We are always at the mercy of the day's weather, and lucky for all, we had absolutely wonderful conditions this year with a high of around 75 degrees, a bit of a breeze, and bright sunny skies. Getting ready for this event always takes a lot of work throughout the prior week, but this year's activity took on a greater intensity. We had some very hot days, some rainstorms, and a cranky HVAC unit that required multiple service visits. On top of all that, we had to prepare the upstairs room for a cultural exhibit to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the expulsion. We thank all who pitched in to make sure everything was in place, with special thanks to the Trenton Donauschwaben and the United German Hungarians for their help in setting up the cultural exhibit.

On Sunday, the Fest opened with a Catholic Mass in the upstairs hall celebrated in German by Father Eugene Wilson, pastor of Holy Cross parish in Springfield, Delaware County. The altar was decorated beautifully as always by Frau Marx, who provided fresh flowers from her garden. George Brenner and Doris Leisch did the German scripture readings and petitions at Mass, while

Ingo Kraus lead us in song with his guitar, capped off with a German-language selection at the end of Mass. The display of crosses with the names of the various camps where so many of our ancestors died provided a touching and appropriate backdrop.

Immediately after Mass, the altar was cleared and the room was opened for visits from anyone interested in the many items detailing typical Donauschwaben life and the books on the topic of the Donauschwaben. Members of the three clubs were there throughout the afternoon to answer questions and provide insight to exhibit visitors. There were several times throughout the day where an Oma or Otta could be seen pointing out an item and explaining it to their Enkelkinder, or sharing a relevant story; in this way all of the effort was proven worthwhile.

Outside, festivities got underway with delicious food: schnitzel, bratwurst, leberkäse, sauerkraut, potato salad, and more. Don Bitterlich provided music throughout the day on his accordion in the main tent area, while several of the Danubia teams engaged opponents on the soccer field. Attendees were treated to dance performances by the Philadelphia-Trenton Donauschwaben, United German Hungarians, and GTV Almrausch. Club president Fred Gauss recognized congratulated GTV Almrausch for winning the 2019 Gaufest competition and the United German Hungarians for placing fourth. The 2019 Cornflower court, Miss German America of Philadelphia Shelby Lynn Reed along with Princess Sarah Gilgenast were in attendance and greeted the crowd from the stage. Danubia soccer player Ashley Fischer was presented with the "Golden Boot" award for being top goalscorer in the Women's Major division last season. Congratulations, Ashley!

Many thanks to all who helped make the day possible: the club members and soccer parents who provided hours of labor during setup and cleanup, Father Wilson for taking time from his busy schedule to say our Mass, Don Bitterlich and the dance groups for their entertainment, the soccer teams for the sporting competition, and to the many attendees from local German clubs including Bayern, United German Hungarians, GTV

Our 5th annual Wine Tasting turned out to be another spectacular event. Once again, Victor Ykoruk, now with Commonwealth Selections, was our host and guide leading a sold-out crowd through the tastings of five wines from either Allegro or Pinnacle Ridge wineries.

pairings Our guests enjoyed food complemented each varietal served. First up was Allegro's 2018 Steel Chardonnay paired with a seafood boat which was a seared avocado half topped with seafood salad. Next came a homemade Chicken and Wild Rice soup paired with Pinnacle Ridge's 2017 Cabernet Franc. Our third course featured a wine favored by many: Allegro's 2017 Duet (Cabernet Sauvignon/Cabernet Franc blend) matched with cavatappi pasta with sweet Italian sausage, kale, cannellini beans, and mascarpone cheese. Next, we sampled Allegro's 2017 Merlot/Chambourcin paired with roast pork tenderloin with a spicy apricot jam and roasted red bliss potatoes. After Victor demonstrated how to properly open a sparkling wine bottle, we enjoyed Pinnacle Ridge's 2017 Brut Rosé accompanied with a Belgian waffle topped with an apple topping, caramel sauce, and whipped cream.

Besides just tasting great food and wonderful wine, we like to get our guests actively involved in the evening. We played games such as Fun with Flags and Last Person Standing where our guests could win prizes.

Many thanks to all who made the evening a success. First and foremost, thanks to our guests that attended and we hope you had a wonderful evening. We couldn't put on such a lovely evening without Victor Ykoruk and we thank him for helping make this a terrific event each year. Lastly, we would like to thank the planners, wine tasting committee, decorators, raffle basket makers, pourers, servers and kitchen help whose efforts made the event possible.

Donauschwaben Cooking Classes

Over the years we have all received the invitation to come to the club and learn to make some of our favorite dishes like schnitzel and potato salad in preparation for Tag der Donauschwaben. Actually, this year the turnout was so good for the "class" that rather than taking an entire day to prepare the schnitzel and potato salad, the students/volunteers finished in the early afternoon. Thank you to all who helped with these preparations.

The teaching does not stop with potato salad and schnitzel. On August 28, a group of our members packed into the club kitchen for another "class" to watch, learn, make, and eventually taste Zwetschgenknoedel, a dish that many of our mothers and Omas brought to us from their Zwetschgenknoedel is a plumb homeland. dumpling coated in buttery breadcrumbs. Using the seasonal Italian prune plumbs and a potatobased dumpling mixture, Clara Titz Fabian provided the recipe, the instruction, and the technique to make the dough, form the perfect Knoedel, and make the tasty treats. Clara also instructed us on making a sweetened buttery breadcrumb sauce as a Knoedel topping which was used in her family's preparation of the Knoedels.

The class was hands on as everyone got involved in preparing the plums, mixing and rolling the dough, and wrapping and shaping the plum dumplings. As my mother used to say, "Viele Hande machen die arbeit schnell am ende" (many hands make the work go by faster). With everyone helping, the group produced enough Zwetschgenknoedel to satisfy all the participants as well as have some to take home and share with their families.

In addition to enjoying the delicious Zwetschgenknoedel, we also heard that "Viele Hande machen viel Spass" (many hands make for a good time). Without a doubt it was a lot of work but there was also a lot of fun had by all. Unlike sitting in a class at school where only the teacher spoke, the kitchen was filled with conversation and

laughter. Thank you, Clara, for putting up with the "students" in your class! Based on the final test which was the taste test, this class deserved an A+++. Our mothers and Omas would be proud!

Recipe Corner

Clara's Plum Dumplings

Ingredients:

- 10 med-large russet potatoes
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 eggs
- Flour (2+ cups, as needed)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 30 Italian prune plums
- Sugar
- Bread crumbs
- Cinnamon (for sauce)
- 1/2 cup butter

Directions:

- 1. Peel and cut up potatoes, place into a large pot with enough water to cover. Add 1 tsp. salt to water. Bring to a boil, cook until tender. Drain and then mash the potatoes, adding 1 tbsp. Butter, then allow to cool.
- 2. When potatoes are cool enough to touch, start adding flour, 1 cup at a time and the eggs. Work the dough with your hands adding more flour, as needed. Turn dough out onto a floured surface, and knead until smooth.
- 3. Split open each plum where it cracks, and remove the pit. Layer into a bowl then sprinkle with sugar into the middle of each plum. Continue with next layer of plums.
- 4. On a floured surface, roll out the dough to 1/4 inch thickness. Cut into 3 inch squares. Place one plum into each square, and bring the corners around to the top. Pinch together all of the seams to seal.

- 5. Bring a large pot of water to slow boil. Place about 5 7 into the water at a time. Once they float to the surface, continue to cook for 5 more minutes. Transfer cooked dumplings to a dish and keep warm.
- 6. Melt butter in large skillet. Stir in bread crumbs, stirring. Begin adding dumplings to brown on all sides. Remove, and add more until they are all browned.

Sauce:

In the same skillet you browned the dumplings, add a couple tsp veg. Oil and sprinkle in more bread crumbs, allow to brown slightly.

Pour in 6 cups water, 3 cups sugar and bring to a boil. Keep stirring, this mixture will thicken as it cooks. To get the consistency you like, sprinkle in more bread crumbs, and sugar. When the thickness is to your liking, sprinkle with cinnamon. Pour sauce over the dumplings and enjoy!!



Jack Koeberlein




