On Sunday, March 2, 2025, we celebrated Fasching with a lot of feasting before Lent began on Ash Wednesday on March 5, with our annual Suppe und Palatschinken Essen. Over 100 people filled the upstairs hall to enjoy the home-made soups and Palatschinken.

On the menu was the excellent potato soup once again prepared by Matt Gauss, who made it the way that his Oma made it. The other soup was a bean soup prepared by Doris Leisch, who managed to prepare the soup the way her mother prepared it. This was quite a feat, since not unlike many of us who try to recreate what our mothers cooked, nothing is written down; Doris also did not have a recipe. Even without recipes, both soups were excellent.

The other item on the menu was Palatschinken. Cheese, apricot, and strawberry filled Palatschinken were offered. Plain, unfilled Palatschinken were also available for those who brought their own special fillings. Other fillings included cinnamon sugar, Nutella, bananas, quince, and Lekvar (prune butter). If someone brought something else, please let us know.

This event could not be held without the enormous effort of the many volunteers. It begins with taking the reservations and continues to the final clean up. Taking reservations requires more than just answering the phone and writing down names and numbers.
